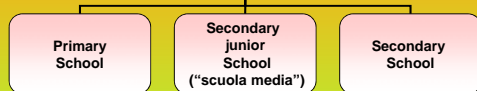


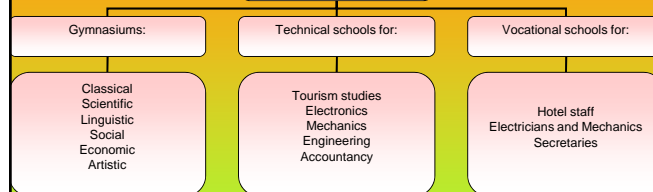
The Italian School System

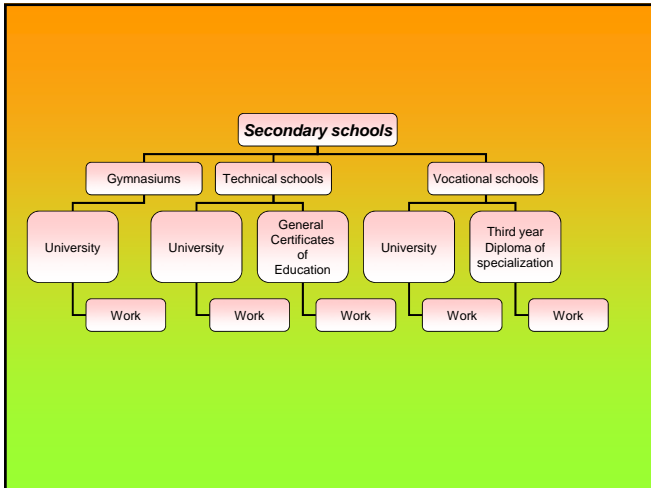


The Italian School System



Secondary School





Public Schools :

- Compulsory for 10 Years
- Completely financed by the State and consequently free of charge
- Can be attended by everyone



Private Schools
(only partially financed by the State) divided in:

- catholic
- non catholic

Primary Schools

(from the age of 6 to the age of 10)

The children of the primary schools have to wear a uniform: pink for the girls and blue for the boys.



Secondary Junior Schools

(From the age of 11 to the age of 13)

The study of two foreign languages is compulsory. First compulsory language: English. Second compulsory language can be chosen among: French, German and Spanish. At the end of the last year the students must sit for an exam to go on studying at secondary school.



Exams

- Junior secondary school leaving exam (at the end of the third year of junior secondary school).
- Secondary school leaving exam or "State Exam" (at the end of the secondary school).
- University degree (at the end of university).
